# FLEETWOOD TOWN COMMUNITY TRUST REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the ended 30 June 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

Fleetwood Town Community Trust (www.fleetwoodtownfcct.com) is a vibrant and active community project that aims to provide socially inclusive community, health and education engagement programmes which aim to make a difference to the lives of people within our communities. A core part of the Trust's work is focused upon educating young people in life skills, promoting self esteem, respect, sportsmanship, social inclusion and healthy active lifestyles. The Trust currently delivers 30 different projects engaging over 13,000 people across all sections of the community.

Objectives of the Trust are as follows:-

To provide tangible community outcomes across our key themes of work including sports participation, education, health and social inclusion.

Create an activity programme that meets the strategic principles of Fleetwood Town FC, The Football League Trust and supports local and national Government policy.

To be a self financing viable charity embedded within the ethos of the football club.

The Trust has experienced growth over the last 12 months in terms of both revenue and human resources. The Board of Trustees offers support and advice on promoting and progressing the work of the Community Trust. Its main focus is to manage and review the work of the partnership with an emphasis on planning and developing strategies to achieve Key performance Indicators (KPIs)

#### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

#### Charitable activities

Over the past 12 months we have continued to grow, building on a solid foundation. Year on year we continue to surpass our targets and 2020 has been another fantastic year for the charity.

Investing in front-line provision across our four key themes; sport participation, health, social inclusion and education, the charity has enjoyed unprecedented growth in all areas. The Trust raised in excess of £900,000 in 2020 to deliver around 30 projects to over 13,000 local people, this is something we are all extremely proud of. Our programmes have raised attainment in schools, developed employment pathways, helped people to get healthier and stay more active, built stronger and safer communities and ultimately made a difference to a record number of people.

In September 2019, we took 35 sports college students on a two-week educational programme to Alicante, Spain, which was funded through EU Erasmus Plus. The trip was a huge success promoting culture and education in and through sport with special focus on skills development.

We also expanded our work into new areas we haven't delivered before, such as working with Active Lancashire and Lancashire Community Rehabilitation Company, with whom we will be launching 'United Together', which is a unique pilot project that provides a peer mentored support package to residents in Lancashire, focussing on strategies that mitigate the risk of reoffending post release from prison. The Trust will also be working with Lancashire Constabulary as we start 'Operation Divert'. DIVERT is an intervention programme to reduce reoffending, which is delivered in the police custody suites and aims to divert young adults aged 18 – 25 away from crime.

We were delighted to welcome on board BES Utilities and Affinity Lancashire as our Corporate Social Responsibility and Community partners. This has allowed us to increase our offering so even more residents can access groups and events across Wyre and Fylde.

Covid-19 has had a significant impact on our earned income from services from mid-March 2020 until the end of the academic year with services and programmes being suspended. The Trust has used furlough since April 2020 for 70% of the Trusts workforce.

Our financial performance against our forecasts has been monitored closely by the Board and the Trusts CEO throughout the pandemic with meetings taking place bi monthly as a minimum, and this will continue for the foreseeable future.

We have implemented an organisational restructure in response to the changing economic climate, resulting in a more, agile, efficient and effective organisation. Also, we have put in place an operational plan with an associated financial forecast that will see us take a phased approach to returning to full capacity in terms service delivery. We believe will return to pre-Covid levels by the end of 2021.

## **Fundraising activities**

The Trust received funding from The Football League Trust to facilitate the activities it provides. It also relied on donations, mascot income from the Football Club and from monies received from schools to subsidise the coaching given.

## **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

#### **Principal funding sources**

The Trust's activities have largely been funded from monies received from The Football League Trust. Such funding has continued since the period end.

## **Reserves Policy**

It is crucial that the Trust has sufficient reserves to tide the organisation over while fundraising is done or to allow an organisation to wind up while meeting its obligation to staff and service users, if existing sources of income are lost.

The Trust is currently dependent on Football League Trust funding via different programmes we deliver to sustain our activities, as earned income alone would not allow the Trust to continue operating. This means that if there were to be a gap in FLT funding it is likely that the Trust would have to close down.

To avoid closure if funding difficulties were to happen the board of trustees has agreed to keep a certain level of financial reserves to ensure that main operations can continue for a period of 3 months.

The main concerns of the board are to ensure:

- · that staff can continue working, primarily to secure new funding
- that members/service users are supported to move on to other services

It has been calculated that reserves of approximately 5% of turnover would be needed to continue running for at least 3 months.

The reserves should be built up from the unrestricted (earned) income. The level of reserves should be calculated and monitored every 4 months by the clubs accountant. This policy should be reviewed yearly and whenever there are significant changes in staff hours or numbers.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

## **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by Companies Act 2006.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are appointed only where they have the necessary skills and commitment to the charity. The Board have recruited individuals from under represented groups to ensure complete with equality and diversity.

## **Organisational structure**

Fleetwood Town Community Trust is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 31 March 2011 and registered as a charity on February 2012. The company was established under Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up the members are required to contribute and amount no exceeding £1.

#### **1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Tangible fixed assets**

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 25% on reducing balance

Computer equipment - 33% on costs

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

## **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

## Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
